# Territorial Acknowledgement

# 2023 Highlights

#### Youth Report

Victoria Pride's Youth Council continues to be active to create opportunities for 2SLGBTQIA+ youth to connect and find community. The council organized a successful Masquerade-themed event at Odd Fellows Hall to kick off the Victoria Pride Festival on June 29. The council also organized another successful activism night where local activists discussed self-empowerment and social justice issues.

The council also made connections with and provided support for Gender and Sexual Alliances at many local schools.

#### **Community Engagement Report**

This year, our Committee Engagement Committee had a new chair and a new vision! We kicked off in January with a dozen members and had more people come in and out throughout the year. The purpose of the group is to consider what kinds of support the communities are missing and either network to make sure people can find the support they need or work to bring it about ourselves. It was through this committee and conversations our chair had with community members that got us talking with the Vicious Poodle about the need for more "sapphic" spaces and shortly afterwards, U-Haul night was born (thanks Henrietta Dubét!).

While many events were discussed and planned—keep an eye out in 2024 for the fruits of these labours!—our crowning jewel was an idea for a new Victoria Pride Society sponsored parade contingent called "My First Pride"! The idea came to us from committee member Alan and was proposed to help those new to the experience find others on a similar path. We had an excellent turnout for the contingent and we even made the paper later that day! Parade members were



also given a pin to commemorate the occasion (thanks to the 2023 members of our communications team, Heather Zeh and Cristin Platt, for the help with the pins!).

In 2024, the group will be meeting every other month and continuing to evolve along with the members who attend and the community we serve. The wishlist this year includes a queer prom, planning for a fundraising gala, having a monthly queer wellness space, partnering with existing groups like Queers and Beers YYJ, and working with Crystal Pool to have a queer, trans\* and gender non-conforming swim. We encourage anyone and everyone to reach out if they'd like a way to be more involved over the course of the year.

#### **Pride Scholarship**

The Victoria Pride Society bursary awarded over \$1600 to a Biochemistry student at the University of Victoria for the 2022-2023 academic year. This bursary was begun by former VPS President David Tillson and awards funds to deserving 2SLGBTQIA+ students.

#### **Partnership Report**

I think it goes without saying that our partners' contributions have been amazing this year! Our partnership donations have surpassed \$160,000.00 with a total of \$51,500.00 cash donations and \$140,737.50 in-kind donations. We've maintained more than 50% of our 2022 partners and have brought on nearly 35% new partners. # Victoria Pride Festival 2023

The 2023 Victoria Pride Festival set a lot of records. We produced five signature festival events in addition to two youth-focused events.

The Victoria Pride Parade saw an estimated 70,000 participants and attendees on a new route down Douglas Street in addition to many more on Chek TV. While we were disappointed to see many hateful stickers and posters had been posted along the route before the parade, we are thankful to the volunteers and community members that worked together to remove them before the start time.

The Victoria Pride Festival in the Park saw over 30,000 attendees, 150 vendors, a kids stage and play area, a DIY art exhibit, beverage services, 20 food options, secure bike parking and more. Over 50 of the best local 2SLGBTQIA+ and ally performers provided over 6 hours of entertainment. This year's addition of a sober area, chill zone and games area in a new layout was well received and we look to build on this for 2024.


The Memorial Drag Ball Game returned to Victoria West Park on July 1 with a thrilling game of antics and community connection. Pride in the Word, hosted by Fierce Brosnan, brought together queer writers from across the province to



discuss their work and read from their most recent publications. The Big Gay Dog Walk saw over 2,000 folks and their best friends at Clover Point for a relaxed community gathering. While the new venue worked well in many ways, the high winds at times were a challenge and we are looking at alternative locations for 2024.

# Financial Report

Over the past year, the Victoria Pride Society has experienced tangible growth in several key financial areas with revenue surpassing \$278,000. Our parade revenue has significantly increased, reflecting a successful turnout and engagement from the community. Vendor sales have also seen a modest rise. Notably, our grant funding has remained consistent with the previous year, providing a reliable financial base for our activities. **Income Sources** 




The introduction of cashless donations was a new initiative for us this year and led to a 50% increase in donation revenue and was well received by attendees.






#### Expenses

We have managed our festival and parade-related expenses prudently, keeping them closely in line with the previous year's costs, which reflects our commitment to careful financial planning. This year's expenditures were just over \$250,000.



Our current cash and receivables balance is substantial, serving as a rainy-day fund. We are actively seeking ways to maximize the return on these funds while maintaining their accessibility.





This year, we were the recipients of a \$23,000 security grant from the federal government-administered fund, part of a larger \$1.5 million support package for Pride organizations across Canada. This grant has helped us cover the increased security costs necessary to create a safe environment for our events.

The Victoria Pride Society continues to benefit from the amazing support of local businesses, organizations, and individuals. Their ongoing contributions are crucial to the success of our events and to the vibrancy of our community. We are incredibly thankful for this support and look forward to continuing these partnerships.
